Remember that all AI is built as an application by humans and large amounts of data are ingested.



**Machine Learning** – a branch of AI and computer science that uses algorithms and data to imitate the way humans learn, gradually improving its accuracy. The 3 types of machine learning are supervised, unsupervised, and reinforcement learning.

## **Use Cases:**

- Natural language processing
- Data Mining
- Speech Recognition
- Caution! Feed ML bad data and one gets bad results. It can be very error-prone
- AI aims to mimic human intelligence whereas ML focuses on learning from data

**Large Language Models** – a type of AI algorithm that uses deep learning techniques and massively large data sets to understand, summarize, generate and predict new content using natural language processing (NLP).

## **Examples of LLMs:**

- GPT 3.5 & GPT-4 from OpenAI
- BARD
- Falcon
- GPT stands for generative pretrained transformer which involves loading (pretraining) it with vast amounts of data

**Blockchain** – created in 2008 as a public transaction ledger for cryptocurrency bitcoin

**Use Cases:**

- Payment processing & money transfers
- Monitoring of supply chains
- Digital IDs
- Data sharing
- Copyright & royalties protection
- Internet of Things Network management
- Healthcare clinical trials and electronic medical records

## **How Blockchain Relates to AI:**

### **What They Do:**

- Blockchain provides a secure, transparent platform for AI to operate
- AI can automate financial processes on the blockchain and offers advanced analytics and automation capabilities for blockchain systems
- AI eliminates the need for intermediaries and improves efficiency.
- AI automated processes include:
  - Invoicing
  - Payment processing
  - Product tracking

**Robotic Process Automation (RPA)** – software bots that perform routine, repetitive tasks for humans based on logical steps taken to complete the task

## **Applications for RPA:**

- In the old days of interfacing, we called it screen scraping
- Anything a human does routinely the same way is a good candidate for RPA
  - Plus, RPA does not need a break!
  - Or a salary
  - And, generally, does not make errors during the execution of the process steps
- A simple design, RPA records the steps the human takes on the computer and duplicates them exactly
- Sometimes referred to as a virtual robot copycat!

**Generative AI** – falling under the broad category of machine learning.

## Use Cases:

- ChatGPT is one such system
  - GPT stands for generative pretrained transformer
  - Can generate an answer to almost any question.
  - Developed by OpenAI and released for testing to the public in November 2022
  - Widely considered the best AI ChatBot ever developed
  - Is an example of a Large Language Model (LLM)
- Has the ability to ingest vast amounts of data – like the entire Internet!
- Generative means that something gets produced by the AI bot (text, video, graphs, etc.)
- AI-generated art models like DALL-E (merging of artist Salvador Dali and Pixar robot WALL-E)

**Multi-modal AI** – Artificial Intelligence that combines multiple types, or modes, of data to create more accurate determinations. This can draw insightful conclusions or make more precise predictions about real-world problems, which allows the model to learn and understand the world in a more comprehensive and nuanced way than traditional AI models.

## **Use Cases:**

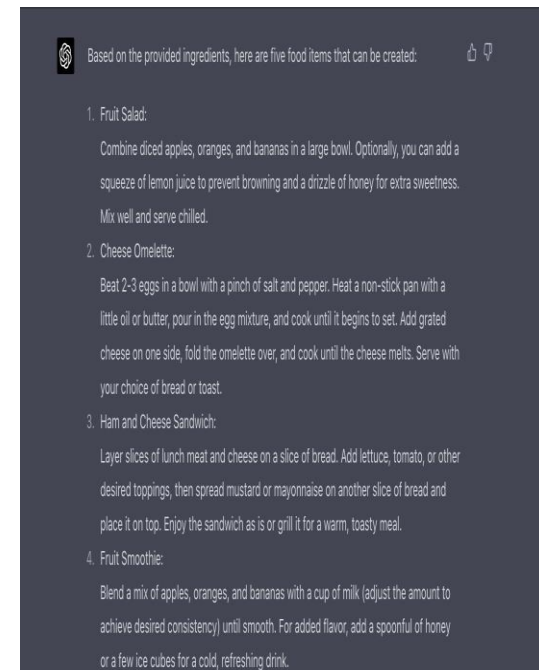
- A Virtual Assistant that responds with text plus pictures, video, or graphics
- Education programs using multi-modal AI have documented success of better retention due to the versatile presentation including visual, auditory, reading, writing, and kinesthetic activities.

**GPT-4** – an AI, Large Language Model system that can mimic human-like speech and reasoning.

## **Details & Use Cases:**

- Trains on a vast library of existing human communication, from classic literature to large swaths of the Internet
- Compared to GPT-3.5, the responses are more coherent, better structured, and more natural-sounding
- This AI model scored in the 90th percentile on the Bar exam!
- 5 interesting things GPT-4 has done recently:
  - Invented a new language
  - Tried to escape its confines?!?
  - Created a game from scratch
  - Detailed how it would take over Twitter
  - Converted a hand-drawn sketch of a website into a working website!

**GPT-4** – a Twitter user recently gave GPT-4 a photo of his refrigerator contents and it came up with several food recipes, using those ingredients, in less than 60 seconds!

**The Point Is That Innovation & Technology Can Get Silly If Not Aligned With The Strategic & Operational Goals Of The Business.**




- Not just data and algorithm biases

## – Other Pitfalls of AI:

- AI can be wrong sometimes
- It is simple to manipulate the information to fit its own agenda (yes, AI has an agenda in the form of its response like the BingCHAT response to Avatar 2 from February 2023)
- AI may limit your creative thinking (how I started my slide deck for this presentation)
- It is simple to misuse AI (family member cheated out of \$) using deepfake capabilities
- It cannot be a substitute for human judgement – this one is extremely important as AI does not have context

# ChatGPT Appears More Empathetic Than Human Doctors When Responding To Patients

## Patients Rated ChatGPT Better Than Real Doctors for Empathy, Advice

### ChatGPT outperforms doctors on patient questions

Overall, the panel said they preferred ChatGPT's responses over physicians' in 78.6% of the 585 completed evaluations. ChatGPT's responses were also longer than the doctors' responses, ranging from 168 to 245 words compared to 17 and 62 words, respectively.

# What is special about LLM AI like GPT-4?



Starts with human writing a program that gives instructions to tweak apparent randomness of trillions of numbers in huge arrays, slightly less random. This is part we understand.



The program is then trained. Here is a sentence from the Internet, what word comes next. At first it does poorly since it is essentially random. When it gets it wrong, the AI tweaks the array of numbers ever so slightly to make them slightly less random. Repeat a trillion times. The end result is the AI program. This part is not fully understood.



Now when presented with a question, the randomness has been transformed into what is most likely and you get results that are sometimes hard to explain how the AI got the answer. This is the scary part.

## Challenges – Legal and Regulatory

- Who is responsible for output. Similar to who is responsible for a self-driving car?
- Current Laws have no consideration for AI
- What makes sense today may not reflect *outdated* laws, but the reality is the outdated law will determine legal decisions
- Data protection and HIPAA don't go away with AI

# Challenges – Ethics

- How do you monitor for misuse?
- Is your model forming a bias?
- Is the organization transparent when AI is being used. Is it ever ok not to be explicit when AI is being used?
  - Corporate AI branding excellent way to do this
- How often do you monitor. Do you have the governance structure in place? Need to keep trust in the model.

# Challenges – Teaching the model

- English is the new programming language – that is, anyone can now be a programmer
- Who is responsible for teaching the model?
- Do you let individuals teach the model on their own behalf?
  - If you do, are you impacting any of the legal and ethical concerns?
  - **BUT**, the power of individual change can be immense. Imagine a model that is your “digital twin”\*

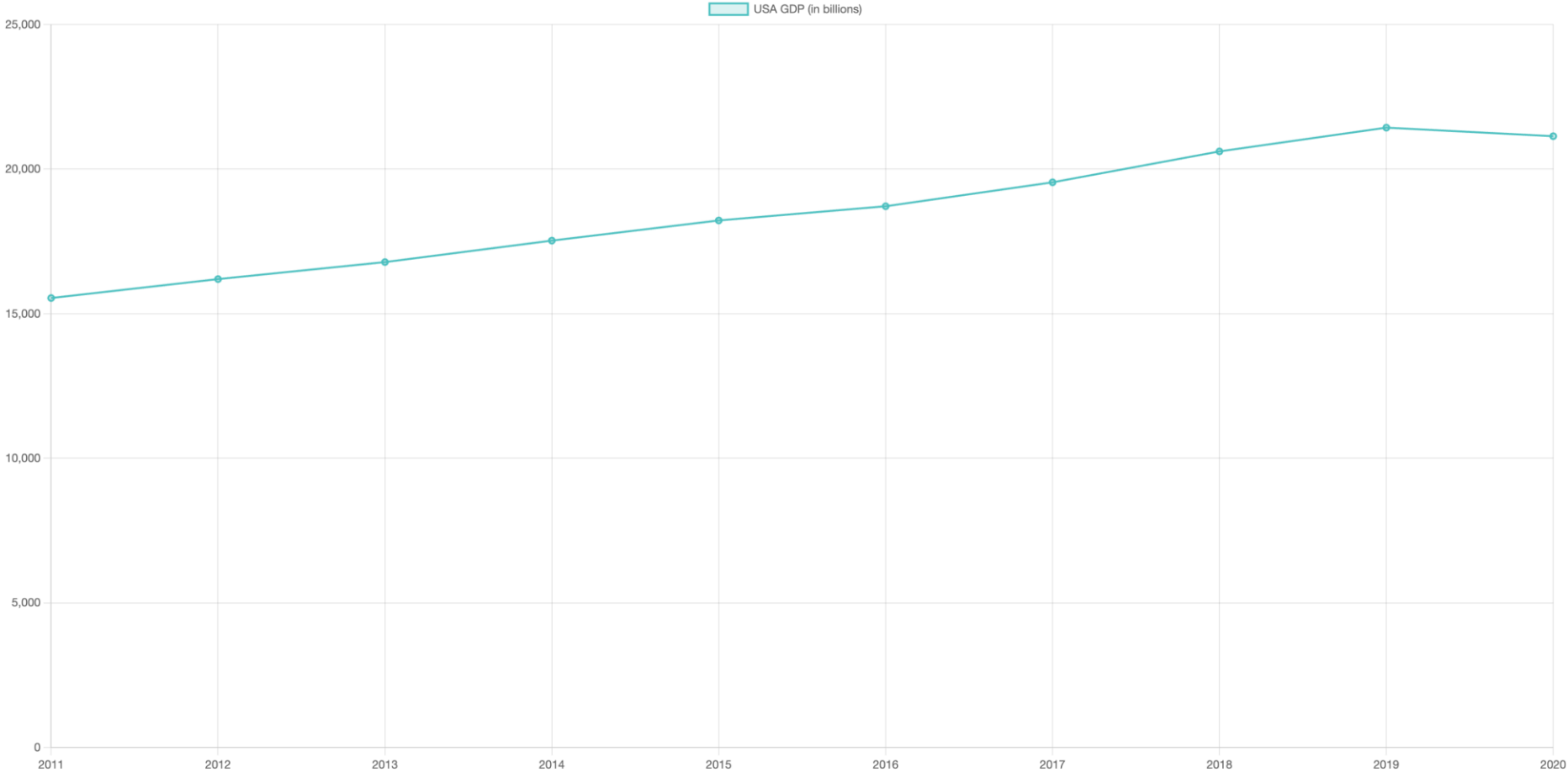

# Ambient Documentation

- Reality now, but still in infancy
- Later this year, human quality reviewer can be removed from process
- Will work just like Dragon, in fact, through the Dragon Mic and interface!
- In 10 years, ambient documentation will be viewed like we view Dragon today – Remember the pushback when Dragon first came out
- Needs more function – update discrete data, real time assist with billing and specificity of documentation, real time order entry

# Institutional Knowledge



**Big problem we constantly hear about is tip sheets created, but not easily to find when actually needed**



**Imagine putting all our institutional knowledge for AI model to digest**

All the tip sheets, policies, forms etc.



**End users now ask "How do I order a Galleri test?"**

Not just the tip sheet, but in plain English what to do with a link to tip sheet



**Or "I need to take LOA, what do I need to do?"**


Not just the policy, but plain English what to do and a link to the form to complete.



**We should do this now! Microsoft.**

# Patient Specific

- Augmented now with available real time ambient documentation
- In patient's preferred language
- At patient's appropriate reading level of language



# Symptom Checker on Steroids

- Rather than just a simple algorithm as we have today
- Using the patient's history, medications, risk factors a custom questionnaire is created
- First pass triage to route to appropriate level and mark at appropriate priority
- Triggers to send patient to 911/ED better than we have now (too many false positive referral to 911/ED currently)

# Automatic Insurance Appeals

- Automatically file prior authorization and appeal letters based on real patient information in a format that insurance company wants and increases chance of approval with no human intervention
- Possible cat and mouse game as insurance companies add similar technology
- AI feedback loop?

# Billing Help

DC

Using the above SOAP note you generated, based on the new 2020 coding standards, what E&M visit code is most appropriate

Considering the information provided in the SOAP note:

1. The MDM seems to be of low complexity, with a single, self-limited problem (post-nasal drip causing paroxysmal coughing) and the management being mostly conservative (adjusting medication and monitoring). There's also the prescription of a 14-day patch monitor, which may increase the complexity slightly.
2. The time spent on the encounter is not provided in the note.

Based on the MDM complexity, for an established patient, the appropriate E&M code could be 99213 (low complexity MDM). If the patient is new, the code would likely be 99203.

# Chat-GPT calls the Zebra!

These symptoms do not fit a single clear diagnosis but can be suggestive of a few different conditions. Some possibilities mentioned in the case include lead poisoning, polio, Guillain-Barre syndrome, and spinal cord compression due to a tumor. However, tests such as MRI scans and a spinal tap have ruled out some of these conditions, like Guillain-Barre syndrome and spinal cord compression.

- Sometimes, AI/technology is not the answer. Don't forget about people and process.

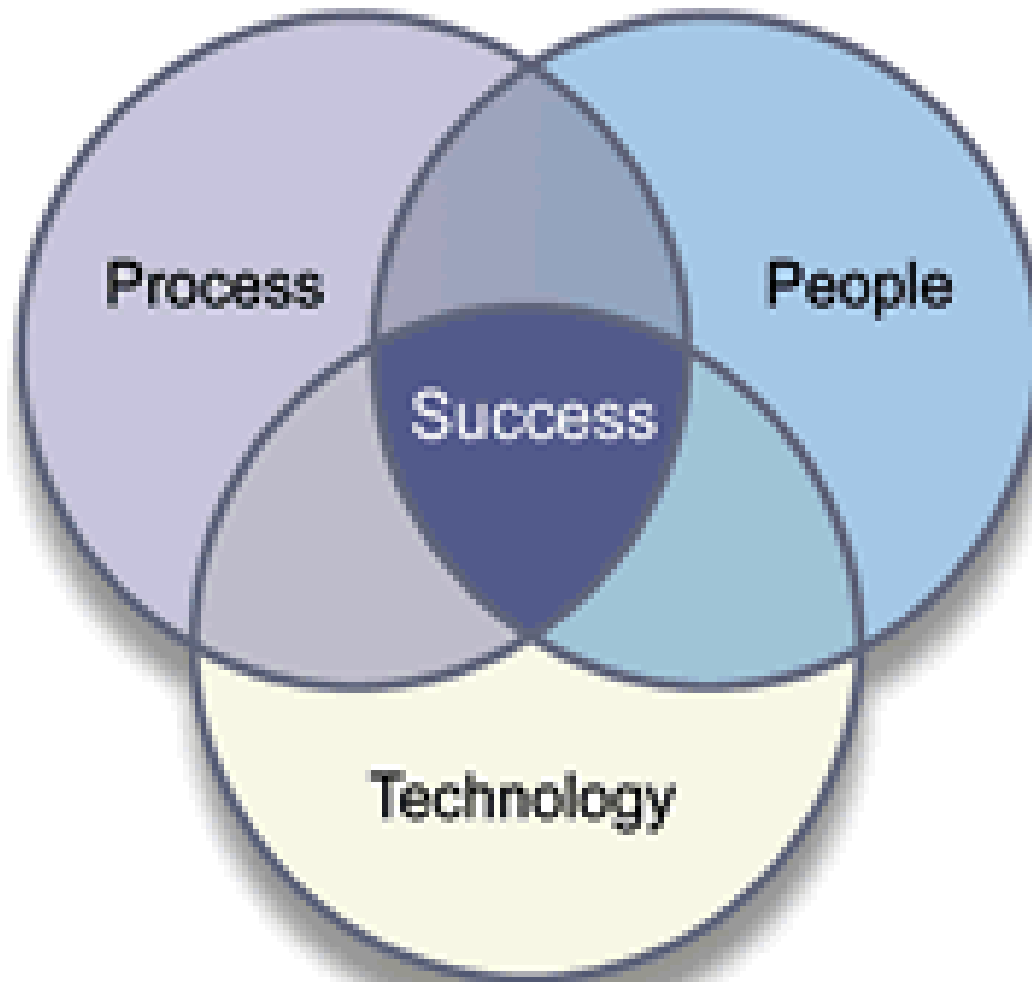
# And Here

# The “Right Way”



- IT shops/Project Managers should be enablers of the business
  - We need to understand the problem in order to recommend any technology solution, including an AI solution.
  - Evaluate & modify/enhance the existing process.
  - Train your people on the enhancements.
  - Track your progress on improvements.
  
- Then evaluate whether AI technology will add further improvements.

- “Shiny Thing Syndrome” – Prominent Player attends a conference and sees a system they simply cannot live without.
- Problem Definition is King!
  - If you can’t write it down on a napkin or a white board, you probably don’t fully understand the whole process.
  - What happens when you automate a bad process?
    - You get an automated bad process that allows you to make mistakes faster than before!
  - Too often organizations fail to evaluate their existing processes for improvement, train their people on the improved process THEN evaluate streamlining the revised process with technology.

- Technology strategy must align with organizational goals and objectives..
- How will technology improve patient care?
- Technology functions to facilitate secure access to all relevant data needed in the delivery of patient care where and when it is needed.
- AI/technology isn't the answer, it's the enabler.

- Great PMs herd all the cats!
- Great PMs narrow the focus to specific tasks.
  - Who, what & when...
- Great PMs understand and manage to scope, schedule & budget.
- Great PMs drive to defined outcomes!
  - Manage to the outcome!

- Technology is changing so fast:
  - Virtualization.
  - Cloud computing.
    - \_\_\_\_\_ As A Service.
  - The reliance on IT is growing each year.
    - The budgets are not always keeping pace with the demand.
  - IT needs to articulate the value to the business.
    - They are enablers.
    - AI/Technology for the sake of it is a mistake!
  - Evaluate workflows and processes first!
    - If you automate a bad process, all you get is an automated bad process.
  - There are reasons why “Bleeding Edge” includes blood!

## – Investments in IT:

- Gartner data indicates 3 – 4 percent of revenues are invested in IT.
  - At Scripps, that's North of \$100 million at 3%.
- Refresh cycles are shrinking.
  - Technology refreshes in 1 – 3 years.
  - AHA guidelines for a PC are 3 years.
- Budgets are not keeping pace with the technology.
- Everyone wants everything!
- IT has to be smarter about what gets implemented and when.
